

Objectives of the meeting -1/2

Share latest progress of Core Group

- First exchange on the proposals submitted by the Colleges
 - To help build contacts, get connected
 - To define route forward for refinement of WP description (Template #2)
 - To discuss WP drivers and priorities
 - To understand what is the need, benefit, impact on the topics to take forward
 - To gather information and arguments to further develop the WPs by identifying synergies

Priority of Focus Funnel is on R&D and StSt workpackage development

Objectives of the meeting -2/2

- The goal of the meeting is <u>not to</u>
 - Discuss technical scope of KM
 - Define the WP in detail
 - Build a consortium
 - Define the task/subtask structure, experiments,
 - Identify who is doing what / Define budgets
 - Pick WP leaders
 - Define the final list of WPs

EURAD-2 scope

 All types of disposal (RWM activities from cradle to grave – except decommissioning) and full range of radioactive waste (from VLLW to HLW)

Based on the same documents: EURAD <u>Vision</u>, <u>Roadmap</u> and <u>updated SRA</u>

- Same objectives and type of activities:
 - Develop, maintain and consolidate the scientific and technical basis of radioactive waste management ⇒ R&D WPs
 - Address important & complex issues and enable expert networking ⇒ Strategic Studies WPs
 - Enhance KM and transfer between organisations, MS and generations ⇒ KM WPs

Participation rules -1/2

- All partners will need to be part of a College (RE, TSO, WMO)
 - Mandated Actor by the Ministries
 - Template to request mandate will be provided by the Core Group once the call is published
 - Affiliated Entity (new term for Linked Third Party)
 - Legal links to be an affiliated entity must be pre-existing and must last longer than the duration of EURAD-2 and have a larger scope
- Associated Partners: participating at their own costs No EC funding
 - UK and Swiss partners
 - International partners
- EURAD-2 will be a flexible and inclusive programme, it is anticipated that only part of the budget will be allocated at the start of the programme (2 waves principle) the remaining will be provisioned under coordinator's budget
 - 1st wave of WPs launched at the start of the programme (defined by Summer 2023)
 - 2nd wave of WPs launched during the course of the programme (defined in 2025-2026)

Participation rules – 2/2

- Partners need to embrace EURAD Vision and principles
 - Positive participation, maintenance of independence, transparent governance, scientific excellence, balanced programme, added value, inclusiveness, equitable financing, complementary participation and tangible results
- EURAD-2 will be a co-funded partnership
 - Commitment to provide the co-financing. Each partner must be able to bear the costs that are not funded by the EC
 - Co-financing will vary depending on the type of activity
 - Partners will actively participating to the work (different from end users)

Key terminology

- Colleges: refers to platforms that gather a number of organisations depending on their role in radioactive waste management, i.e EURADSCIENCE (for Research Entities), SITEX.Network (for Technical Safety Organisations) and IGD-TP (for Waste Management Organisations)
- **WP Preparation Teams**: refers to a group of 3 persons (one per College) who will be the main contacts for the development of each EURAD-2 workpackages. This will be defined in April via the Colleges. They are not necessarily the future WP leaders.



Knowledge Management Work Packages

Establishment of a KM Committee

- Priority of Focus Funnel is on R&D and StSt workpackage development
- EURAD-2 Knowledge Management Committee = KMC will be established
 - Any ideas regarding KM issues that have already been submitted will be transferred to KMC
- Role and boundaries:
 - Discuss with the Colleges the expectations how the KM activities should be established (priorities / type of activities)
 - Provide recommendations to Core Group, which then reports to Colleges for decision / approval
 - Members do not represent their institute or country
 - KMC is not a prefiguration of KM WP leaders members will not necessarily have leadership role / commitment in EURAD-2 implementation (similar to Core Group)

Knowledge Management WPs


- EURAD-2 proposals for KM will describe the type of actions, not the technical topics/content on KM.
- It is additionally foreseen that each R&D and StSt WPs will have a KM task. This will be prescribed by the Knowledge Management Committee and Core Group.
- Individual institutes do not need to take action on KM at this stage.
- It is anticipated that approximately xx % will be dedicated to KM WPs

Description of the KMC

- Further guidance for the KMC operations and expectations will be provided by early May
 2023
- One moderator: Paul Carbol (JRC, Germany) will feed the KMC with his experience in EURAD and PREDIS
- Named members by the Colleges :
 - RE: Gunnar Buckau (KIT-PTKA, Germany), supported by Alba Valls (Amphos21, Spain) and Niels Belmans (SCK CEN, Belgium)
 - TSO: Jitka Miksova (SURO, Czech Republic)
 - WMO: Alexandru Tatomir (BGE, Germany), supported by Anders Sjöland (SKB, Sweden)

- Based on feedback, Core Group communication to Colleges about WP grouping proposal and guidance for WP Preparation Teams definition

Mid-April

- Colleges share feedback on the proposed grouping suggestion
- Colleges share nominated organisations and persons to be in the WP Preparation Teams
- Core Group issue the Template #2

Mid-May

- WP Preparation Teams send completed Template #2 to Core Group for general checking
- Core Group send feedback to WP Preparation Teams (3 open days after reception of Template #2)

• WP Preparation Teams send updated Template #2 to Colleges

Early July

 Colleges share feedback to Core Group on Template #2 with their new prioritization

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Process of WPs: from Colleges to Core Group merging

Description of the process


- Core Group issued Template #1 in December 2022 and made a presentation on how to complete it during the Webinar #1 (January 2023)
- Colleges were asked to forward by the end of February their 15 top priorities
- Each College defined a deadline for submitting the Templates #1
- By end of February, each College forwarded to Core Group the selected proposals

Outcomes of the process

- Lots of discussions between the Colleges
 - Not explicitly asked for but this is good sign of collaboration
- No proposals rejected at this stage
 - 22 proposals from the Research Entities College
 - 19 proposals from the Waste Management Organisations College
 - 14 proposals from the Technical Safety Organisations College

Suggested Synergy & Grouping of WP ideas

EURAD Roadmap Themes



Step by step approach

- Identification of common proposals
 - Review of all proposals per Theme to search for potential synergies
 - No WPs were submitted in Theme 6 (Siting and Licensing)
- Identification of commonalities between WPs
 - For a balanced agenda some proposals were moved in other Theme equilibrated spread of WP ideas over the different Themes
- Identification of first institute pitching
 - Linked to the selected drivers and based on Colleges' main competences when some WPs were grouped, as well as on the end-user perspective
 - Balance between the three Colleges
 - Availability of the speakers
 - Choice and order of the speakers is not reflecting the WP leadership


